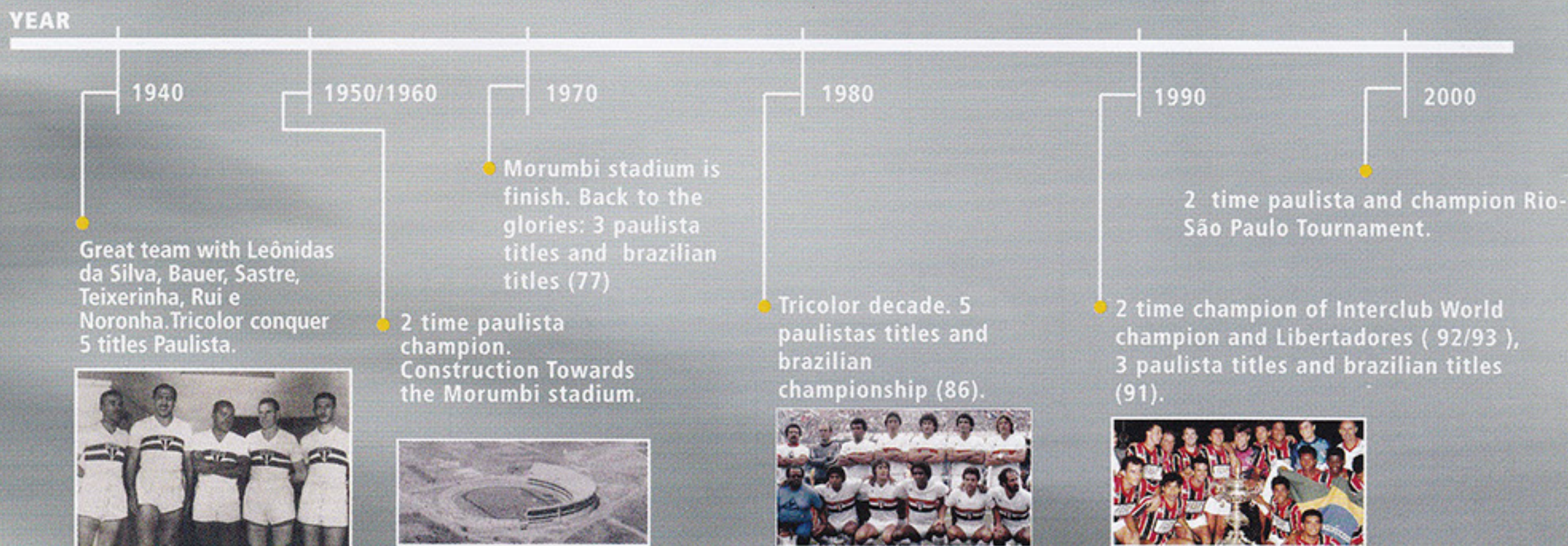
Obtaining maximum representation of Brazilian Football abroad, Sao Paulo Football Club - an association that has always based itself in planning and professionalism - became

A pioneer, of modernization and professionalism, especially when the subject is technology and sporting infrastructure. Mixing the experience of established Football stars with the young talents, Sao Paulo conquered Brazil, the Americas, Europe, the World and proudly maintain the status of champions.

The history of Sao Paulo Football Club goes against the theory that a club is not created to be a champion from one day to another. With two birth certificates - the first one dated from January 25, 1930, when Sao Paulo da Floresta arose (fusion of Paulistano Athletic Club and Palmeiras Athletic Association) and the second one, dated from December 16, 1935, in a meeting carried out in the office of Dr. Jose Carlos Freire, on Rua 11 de August - Sao Paulo was destined to be victorious.

Today it is the club with the greatest number of titles conquered in Brazil and leading, proudly, the ranking of the country four times word champion, it stands out as the first Brazilian Club in the word ranking and first in the Football ranking of Sao Paulo (it is the club with the biggest technical efficiency, from the promulgation of the Access Law in 1949, according to the Football Federation of Sao Paulo

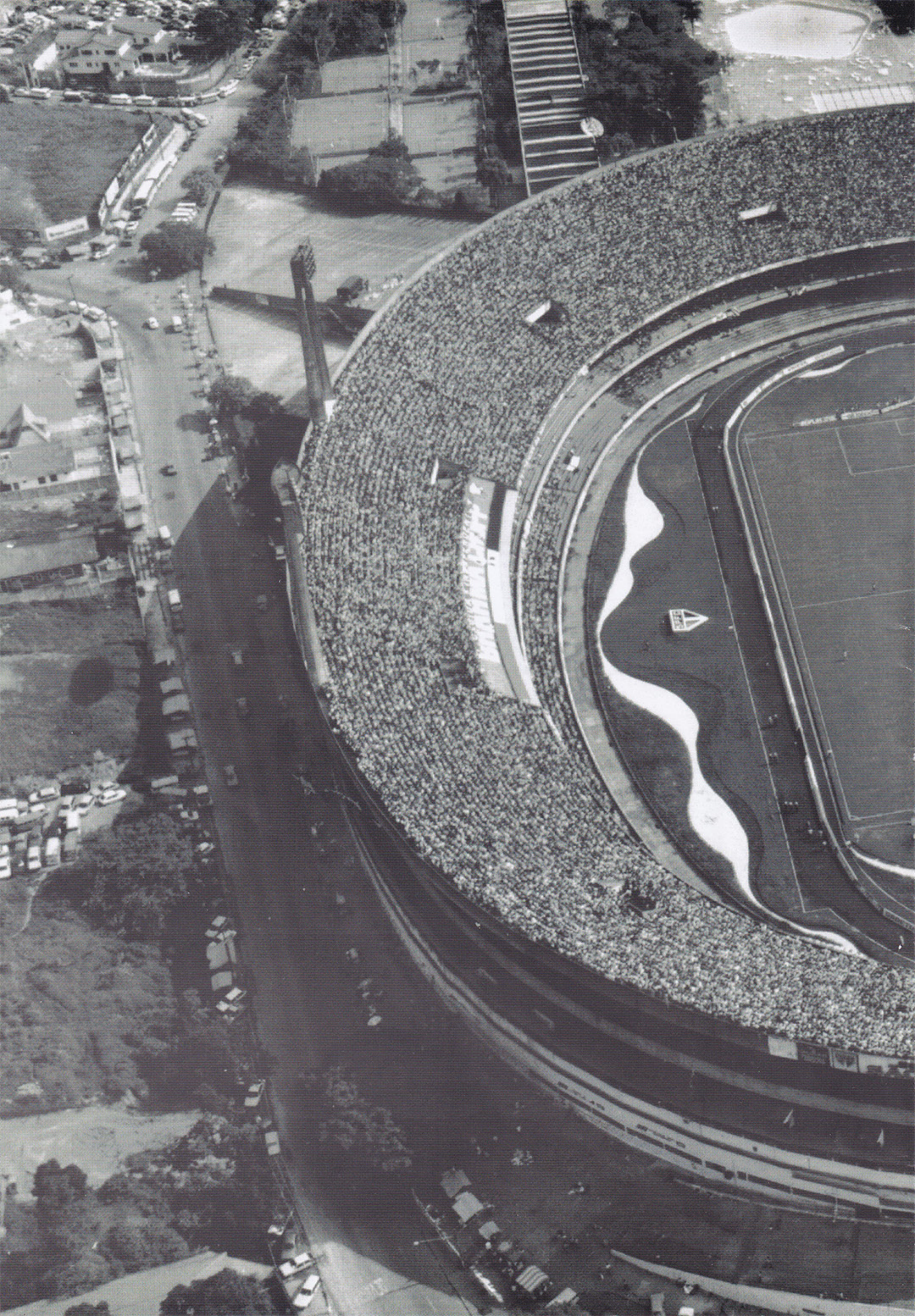

The Morumbi Stadium is one of the biggest sports complexes in Latin America.

The Cicero Pompeu de Toledo Stadium, The Morumbi. Left behind the title of the biggest private stadium in the world (welcomed 120 thousand seated people and on October 13, 1977 it got 146.082 fans) and acquired the reputation of the safest and most modern (its capacity was reduced to 85,000 seats, aiming for more safety, comfort and convenience) the Morumbi fulfills 100 % of the criteria demanded by FIFA. Partially inaugurated on October 2, 1960 (1x0 over Sporting, from Portugal) and totally on January 25, 1970. It's the first club in Brazil to respect the rights of handicapped fans, facilitating their access to the stadium.

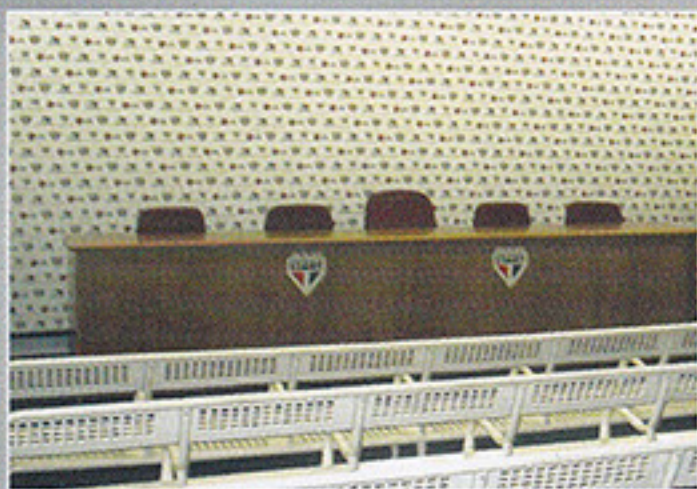

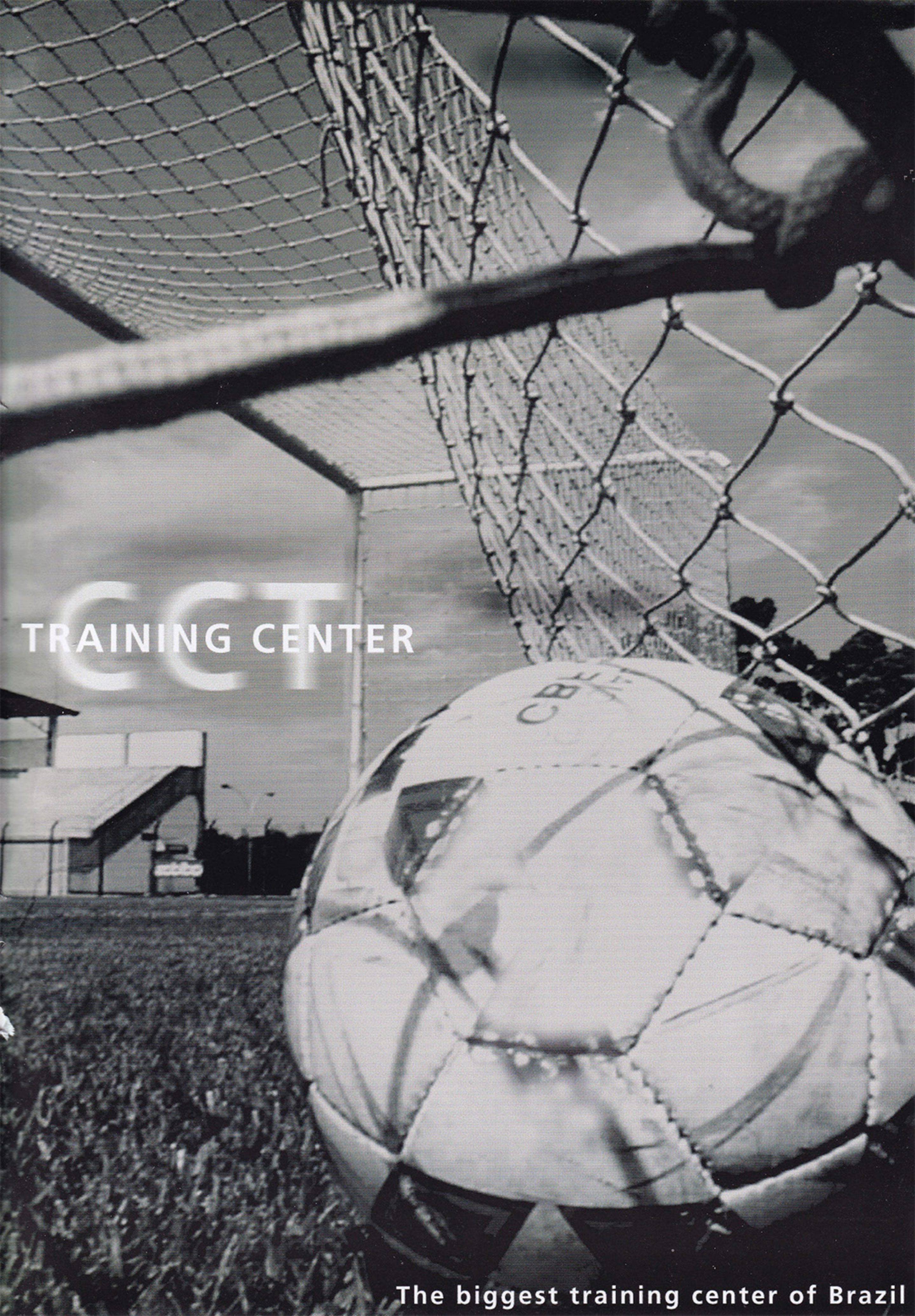
Leisure at the social club

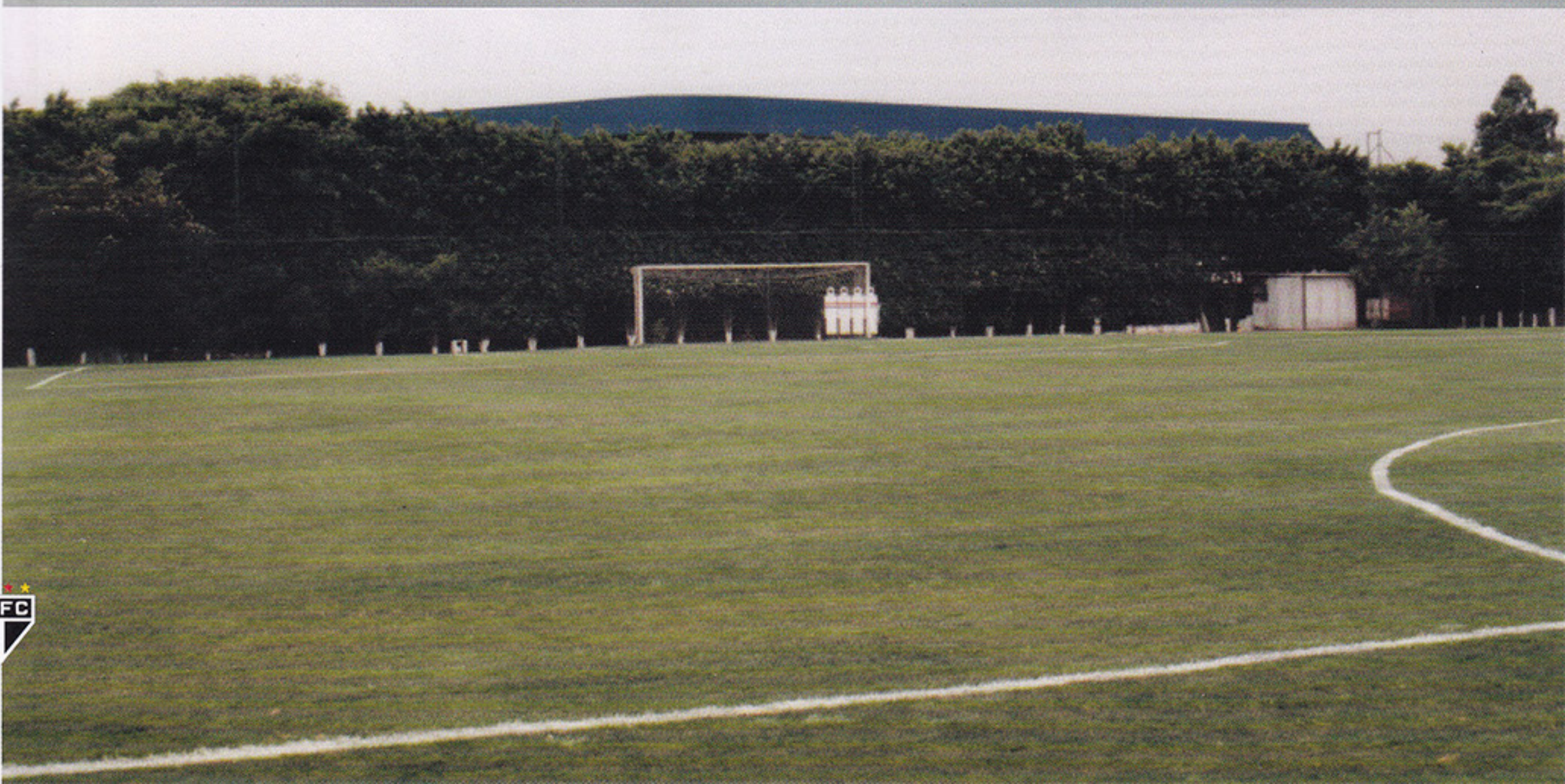
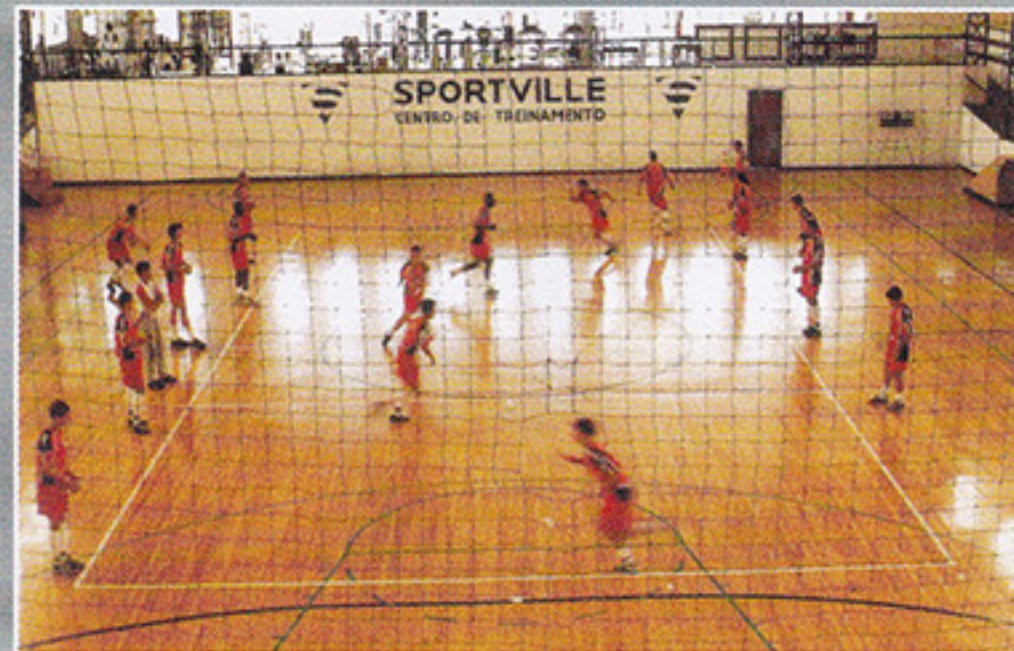

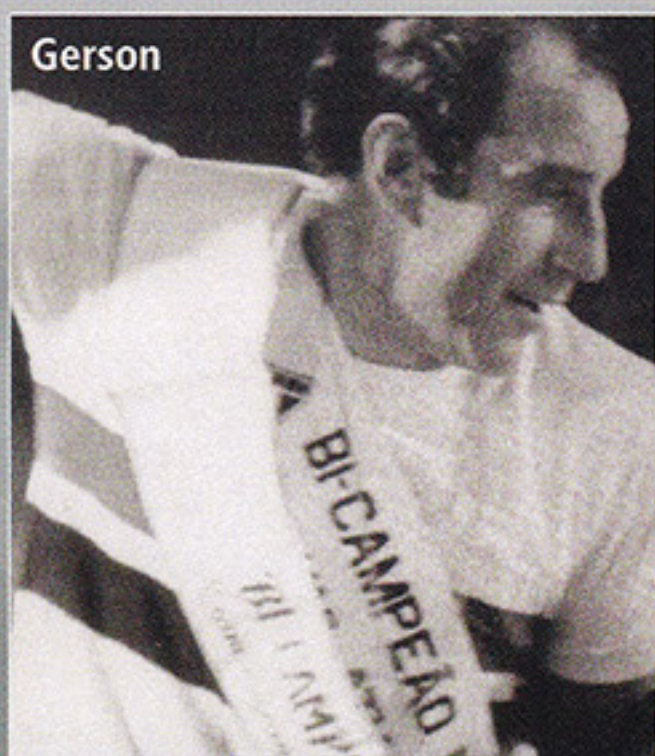
